Edgefield Manufacturing Company Adds 40 Jobs

Columbia, SC--Edgefield Manufacturing Company has announced that it will add 40 employees and invest \$2 million in its Edgefield County operating facility.

Edgefield Manufacturing Company is a joint venture established by Martin IMI and Matco Distribution, Inc. The company, which will produce plastic pellets and fiber from recycled materials, will locate in the former Martin Color-Fi buildings.
