Urban Outfitters Brings 200 New Jobs to Edgefield County **Company to open fulfillment center in Trenton**

Urban Outfitters, Inc., a specialty clothing and accessories company, announced today that it will relocate its Direct Consumer Fulfillment Center from Pennsylvania to the Edgefield County community of Trenton. The company has agreed to purchase the equipment and to lease the 459,000-square-foot facility formerly operated by VF Corp.

Urban Outfitters will initially hire approximately 200 to staff its fulfillment center. In addition, the company is considering locating its inbound call center in Edgefield County, which could create an additional 200 jobs in the area.

Urban's relocation decision was driven by the exceptional recruiting effort by the state, county and local community, as well as by the work ethic of South Carolina workers, company officials said. Urban evaluated facilities and sites in several other states including its home state of Pennsylvania, West Virginia, Maryland and New Jersey before choosing South Carolina.

"We considered a variety of locations, but South Carolina offered so many attractive factors that we were convinced it was the right place to be," said Urban Outfitters CFO John Kyees. "We found a building and workforce that ideally suited our needs. Also, we were impressed by the pro-business environment and the exceptional efforts by the South Carolina Department of Commerce, the Economic Development Partnership, the Edgefield County Economic Development Committee and a host of business and community leaders to make us feel welcome in South Carolina."

The company's direct fulfillment division, which will be entirely located in South Carolina, is the fastest growing segment of the company, growing 91 percent in 2004 and expected to grow an additional 50 to 60 percent in 2005. The division fulfills orders directly to consumers and is driven by sales via catalog and the Internet.

"We've been focused from day one on creating jobs in our rural communities and this announcement is obviously an important step forward on that front," said Gov. Mark Sanford. "We're going to stay focused on creating jobs in every corner of our state, which starts with improvements to our underlying business climate so that economic development folks have the tools they need to attract jobs and capital investment. We're going to continue pushing for additional income tax relief that makes South Carolina even more attractive to companies like Urban Outfitters that are looking to grow and expand."

"We are pleased that Urban Outfitters is leveraging the competitive advantages of South Carolina such as our business-friendly climate, quality-driven workforce and our strategic location for distribution success," said Commerce Secretary Bob Faith. "As this company grows, we look forward to doing everything possible to help it grow in South Carolina."

"We are delighted that Urban Outfitters is coming to Edgefield County," said Chairman of Edgefield County Economic Development Bettis Rainsford. "This is exactly the kind of company we want to bring home to our county. It is well managed, rapidly growing and provides a great work environment to its employees. We are confident that the company's new facility will enable it to accelerate its pace of growth into the future."

Urban Outfitters will hold a job fair for customer service-oriented positions from 3:00-7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 17. The job fair will be held at the company's new facility, which is in the Edgefield Industrial Park, located on Highway 25 at exit 5, nine miles north of I-20. The jobs will pay a competitive wage and will give the employees an opportunity to join a fast-growing business with career growth potential. Urban anticipates total sales in the current fiscal year to exceed \$1 billion.
